

Subject Specific Information:


- Phonics is taught through a systematic synthetic phonics program called Read Write Inc. All reading books are matched through Read Write Inc also



How will the first few days work?

- Part-time intake for first two days (Thursday 2nd September and Friday 3rd September)
- Class is split into two even groups
- Morning children will arrive at school for 8.45am on the playground and come in through the classroom door. They will be collected from school at 11.30am.
- Afternoon children will arrive at school via the front office at 12.30pm. They will stay until 3.15pm and be collected from the playground at the rear of school.
- On Friday, all children to attend in the morning, stay for lunch and to be collected at 12.30pm
- Full days from Monday 6th September 2021



Baseline and getting to know your child

- The first two weeks of school is dedicated to getting to know your child, spending time with them in play, observing, celebrating what they can do already and formulating their baseline
- New Reception baseline, which will become statutory in 2021
- Routines and boundaries built in this time

P.E Uniform:

Red and white gingham dress

This consists of a red and white t-shirt (please ask for the 'new style' t-shirt at Whittakers), black shorts, black school pumps and black or grey tracksuit bottoms for both girls and boys. This should be brought in at the start of term and will come home with the children at the end of each term. Children will spend some time outside every day, so they will need adequate clothing and footwear. Items can be placed in a drawstring bag and will remain your child's peg. School PE bags are available to purchase from the school office, but I would advise letting your child choose their own drawstring bag for their PE kit so that they can easily identify it. **PLEASE MARK EVERYTHING WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.**

- Snack consists of items such as pancakes, cereal, wraps, cheese & crackers etc


Breakfast Club
