## Teacher Strike – Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> February

### PLEASE NOTE - CHANGE TO PREVIOUS STRIKE

Dear parents/carers,

You will likely be aware from media coverage that the NEU teaching union have declared further strike action, which will take place on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> February. The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teachers' pay and not because of any issues at St John Vianney.

The teachers at St John Vianney are in different unions, therefore, **not all classes will be affected by strike action. The following classes will be closed on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> February:**

- Year 1
- Year 3
- Year 4
- Year 6

All other classes will be able to attend school as normal. **Breakfast club** will run as normal on this day.

**Children not attending who are eligible for a free school meal** will have a packed lunch provided for them if they so wish. Parents are free to come to school to collect this from 11.45 AM. **Please email or telephone school as soon as possible if you would like to order a lunch for your child(ren).**

I am sorry that some of you will have to make alternative arrangements for your child at short notice, and that they will experience disruption to their education. I understand that this situation may be frustrating, but I ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with respect. St John Vianney remains committed to providing a safe and secure environment for our pupils and delivering high-quality teaching.

We are working closely with union representatives to keep up to date with the situation, and I will inform you as soon as possible if arrangements change. **Arrangements for the other two planned strike days (15<sup>th</sup> March and 16<sup>th</sup> March) will be communicated nearer the time but are likely to follow a similar pattern.**
